Pastor's Article

Dear Friends,

It is a new year, one that some of you will be glad to begin, and one that others might be feeling reluctant to enter. Isn't life always this way—sometimes you want to prolong every moment, and other times you can't wait for a stage of your life to be over.

Sometimes, we want to drop the past, like a hot potato. Perhaps we're living with the consequences of a bad decision. Perhaps we are tortured with the "what if's" and "why not's" of life. As we consider the new year, why not take a moment to remember that our faith promises second chances. Even when we've messed up royally, God offers us forgiveness, and a new way forward. Of course, we still need to do our best to make amends and to try to correct whatever problems we might have caused by our actions, but the ultimate answer always is, "You are my beloved children; I forgive you."

Some folks think Christians dwell too much on forgiveness. It's as if they think we make up ways to feel guilty, then put each other and ourselves down. Actually, life does a great job at making us feel insignificant, wrong, not good enough. The church exists to give us God's antidote to these negative messages. We proclaim it is possible to teach an old dog new tricks; to change one's heart as well as one's behaviors. How do we know? Because our Bible tells us again and again of God's forgiveness.

God's forgiveness extends to things we've done by mistake, not just deliberate wrong-doing. Sometimes, we never saw that what we did, or didn't do, could cause harm or hurt feelings. I think of children playing near the big plate of glass, stumbling, and one getting hurt by falling against the glass. No one deliberately caused this accident, but everyone felt horrible. God's forgiveness extends to unintentional consequences, and does not assign blame.

This January, why not remember your baptism, and the waters washing away everything that separates you from God? Perhaps you might want to incorporate water in a ritual—when you wash your face, you remember God's washing you with love, and Jesus' promise that he would become living water to all who thirst.

Happy New Year! May this year bring you ever closer to the love of God through Christ Jesus, Our Savior.

Pennsylvania Southeast Conference News An Epiphany Reflection from the Conference Minister

Tony Robinson reminded me several years ago that the name of this month, "January," comes from the ancient Roman deity, Janus - a lesser god but one who has always made sense to seekers after the heart of the Divine. Janus was the god of gates and doorways. He had two faces, one looking forward, another looking backward. So there is only a little surprise and much gratitude that in Psalm 121 God keeps a particular vigilant watch at our times of "going out and coming in," our times of ending and beginning, and all that is between the two.

Sometimes January, and the beginning of a new year, feels like that. I look back over the year now past. And I peer into the new one just underway. Sometimes I'm not quite sure if I'm coming or going -- which gets reinforced in the New Year every time I write the previous year in the date space on any form I have to sign.

Transitions -- whether of the calendar or in the seasons of our lives – are crazy-making times. They can be confusing and exhilarating; chaotic and creative. That certainly has been true of our conference life. That's true of our congregational lives where all of us worship in "the church that has been" feeling anxious about "the church that will be." And it's true of our personal lives where change (those we make happen and those that happen to us) is the only constant.

But that is NOT the only constant. When everything else may seem up for grabs or in flux, one thing is not: God's abiding light and love. "I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. When you search for me, you will find me..."

This I know to be true. And it is my prayer for you and all our brothers and sisters in Christ that we move confidently into this New Year holding fast to that which has been good ready to receive what is going to be even better.
